WARNING

- ⚠ This tent is made with fabric that meets CPAI-84 specifications for flame resistance. It is not fire proof. The fabric will burn if left in continuous contact with any flame source.
- ⚠ Heat sources burn oxygen and emit carbon monoxide. Use caution with heaters and vent properly.
 - Do not use candles, matches or open flames of any kind in or near a tent.
 - Do not cook inside a tent.
 - Build campfires downwind and several meters away from a tent and be sure to fully extinguish campfires before leaving a campsite or before retiring for the night
 - Exercise extreme caution when using fuel-powered lanterns or heaters inside a tent and use battery-operated lanterns before going sleep
 - Extinguish or turn off all lanterns before going to sleep
 - Do not refuel lamps, heaters or stoves inside a tent
 - Do not smoke in a tent
 - Do not store flammable liquids inside a tent
- ⚠ Proper securing of blind is necessary to avoid damage to blind due to high winds or unattended use. Secure blind to the ground using provided ground anchors and tie-off straps or to tower structure using provided hardware per instructions.

It is recommended to close all windows while not in use to block out wind, rain and avoid unnecessary damage.
- ⚠ **Always** check local laws and regulations for blaze orange requirements before using a hunting blind. When gun hunting, you should always attach a blaze orange safety cap to the roof of blind for added safety from other hunters.
- ⚠ **Never** allow children to play in this product.
- ⚠ **Never** allow the material to cover your face. This material can cause suffocation and death if it is placed over your face.
- ⚠ **Always** wear eye and ear protection!

INSPECTION AND MAINTENANCE






- Never put blind away wet. Always put away dry to avoid mildew.
- Take down blind when not in use to avoid unnecessary damage and fading.
- Seal the seams with seam sealer and the walls and roof with silicon spray if leaking occurs.
- Use extra tie-downs during excessive winds.











UV WARNING

- ⚠ Ultraviolet light breaks down lightweight fabric fibers. the material will fade, lose strength and eventually disintegrate if left in prolonged sunlight. To extend the life of your ground blind, avoid leaving it out in direct sunlight for extended periods of time. Set it up in a shady area whenever possible. Fading or discoloring of blind is not covered under your warranty.

SET-UP INSTRUCTIONS

STEP 1 & 2

1. Remove the blind from carry bag.
2. Lay the blind flat on the ground so any wall panel is facing upward. Be completely sure there is no material twisted or overlapping the ends of any poles. **SEE FIGURE 1.**

3. Grab the handle on the eyelet located in the center of wall and pull upward so it pops open. **SEE FIGURE 2.**
NOTE: Walls are meant to be strong/ridged and will require a fair amount of force to pop over center for set up
4. Repeat step 3 for the remaining walls so the blind is standing up. **SEE FIGURE 3.**

- Unzip the door and enter the blind. Place palm of your hand on the roof hub and push the spring loaded roof straight up until it pops over center. **SEE FIGURE 4.**

NOTE: For easier set up, it's best to open up some window panels to allow light into blind for better visibility.

NOTE: The roof hub is under spring tension; use extreme caution when popping roof up and collapsing roof down to avoid injury to face, head or hands. Keep fingers clear of roof hub/pole ends to avoid pinching fingers.

STEP 6 - VERY IMPORTANT STEP!




FIGURE 5A - CORRECT INSTALLATION WITH ROOF POLES ON OUTSIDE EDGE OF LOCK HUB

- Spin the roof lock clockwise (upward) to lock roof poles in place. **SEE FIGURE 5A.** You must push upward on roof fabric to make sure roof lock fully engages and that **ALL** (4) poles are on the outside rim of roof lock.

The roof lock should be nested tightly with roof poles on outside edge of the roof lock **SEE FIGURE 5A.** The roof lock is installed wrong if the roof poles are on top of the roof lock leaving a gap **SEE FIGURE 5B.**






FIGURE 5B - WRONG INSTALLATION WITH ROOF POLES ON TOP OF LOCK HUB

STEP 7 - 9



7. Unpack the horizontal and vertical spreader poles from the pole bag.
8. Starting with the (4) horizontal spreader poles with the disc shaped ends, place one end into slot on any top corner hub. Make sure clamp is in the unlocked position. **SEE FIGURE 6A & 6B.**

Insert opposite end of spreader pole into slot of top corner hub located across the same side of blind. Slight rotation of the spreader pole will help with full engagement of each pole end into the slots.

9. Repeat step 8 for remaining (3) horizontal spreader poles. **DO NOT** lock clamps yet.

10. Attach Velcro around spreader poles located in center top. **SEE FIGURE 7.**





11. Install (4) vertical spreader poles with the round peg ends. With clamp on the vertical pole in the unlocked position, place peg into hole on bottom corner hub. **SEE FIGURE 8A & 8B.**

NOTE: The larger diameter pole should go towards the bottom corner.

12. Slide the pole up and place peg into hole in top corner hub. You will need to keep pressure on bottom pole to ensure both pegs stay located in the hubs. **SEE FIGURE 9A & 9B.**
13. While keeping vertical poles spread apart, flip clamp lever on the vertical pole into the locked position.
14. Repeat step 12 for remaining (3) vertical spreader poles.









15. Go back to the (4) horizontal spreader poles; while spreading them outward (tight), flip clamp lever into the locked position. **SEE FIGURE 9A & FIGURE 9B.**

NOTE: Once all of the poles are clamped locked return to the roof lock and give it one final twist to ensure it is tight.

16. Remove the ground stakes from bag. Pull each corner outward (taut). Pound a long straight ground stake in hole located on outside bottom corner hub. **SEE FIGURE 10.** Repeat for all four corners.

NOTE: Pounding the stake at an angle is a more effective way to stake down your blind.



17. Anchor the side walls by attaching the short part of the strap to eye bolt. **SEE FIGURE 11.**
18. Attach the long strap to spiral anchor. **SEE FIGURE 12.**

19. Measure the distance from side wall eye bolt to approximate location of spiral anchor, and twist anchor into ground.
20. Feed end of long strap through cam lever on short strap on eye bolt. Pull tight. **SEE FIGURE 13.**
21. Repeat steps 17-20 for remaining sides.




FIGURE 14A - LOCKED POSITION




FIGURE 14B - UNLOCKED POSITION

1. Remove all ground stakes and store them in the provided bag.
2. Remove all native brush from brush holder straps.
3. Unscrew the roof lock fully by rotating counter-clockwise until it hits nut on bottom of bolt. **SEE FIGURE 14A & 14B.**
4. Unlock all vertical and horizontal spreader poles and remove. Horizontal poles may need a twist to remove from slots.
5. Slide spreader poles to shortest length and lock all clamps before storing in pole bag provided.
6. Close all windows.

7. Carefully pull roof down by placing your hands on two roof poles opposite of each other. Place hands 4-6 inches away from center hub. **SEE FIGURE 15.**

NOTE: The roof hub is under spring tension; use extreme caution when popping roof up and collapsing roof down to avoid injury to face, head or hands. Keep fingers clear of roof hub/pole ends to avoid pinching fingers.





8. Zip door closed.
9. From outside of blind push in each wall allowing them to fold onto themselves. **SEE FIGURE 16.**
10. Blind will be back in its flat stage just as it was when it was unfolded out of the backpack bag. Gather all corners of the blind and fold together. Do not force the blind when folding. Watch for entanglement of poles. Use the long packing strap to wrap around blind and tighten.
11. Place folded blind back into the backpack carry case with the hubs toward the bottom end of bag always.
